Through his practice, Koenig Mediation, LLC, he helps individuals and families resolve disputes privately, efficiently, and on their own terms — treating litigation as a last resort rather than a first step.

In family matters, Mr. Koenig guides separating and divorcing parties through the issues that matter most to them — parenting arrangements, support, and the division of property — under California Family Code standards and the best-interest-of-the-child framework. In landlord-tenant and unlawful detainer matters, he works with both housing providers and tenants to reach durable agreements that address rent, habitability, and possession, consistent with California law and Los Angeles County and City housing regulations. In both areas, his approach is the same: create a confidential, balanced setting where each side is heard and a workable resolution can take shape.

Mr. Koenig is fluent in both English and Spanish and conducts mediations in either language, allowing participants to take part fully and comfortably in the language they know best. He is also deeply attuned to Latin American cultural values and communication styles, which helps him build trust and ensure that every party feels understood and respected throughout the process. He is certified in Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) and conducts mediations both in person and remotely. His practice is built on neutrality, confidentiality, and respect for each party's right to decide the outcome of their own dispute.
